- A skill sheet is required for each team member, listing: 1. Type of equipment you have used, 2.
   Construction projects you have worked on, 3. Experience you have had on roofs, windows, plumbing, concrete, and 4. Painting, hand sawing, shoveling, cleaning concrete walls, etc. This information will determine team assignment.
